By the 15 of February we will publish the list of all the special groups and will offer the participants to the conference the opportunity to subscribe to a group. The groups will be officially recognized and programmed, and provided a room, when they have a minimum of 6 members, so advance signing up is important. Smaller groups will be offered a common room for self-organization.
