Rodolfo has a degree in Physics (MPhys) from the University of Milan and a PhD in Tourism Management from the University of Queensland (Australia). After having worked for more than twenty years in the Information Technology, he is presently at Bocconi University, Milan where is coordinator of the Information Systems and Communication Technology area at the Master in Economics and Tourism, and Research Fellow at the Dondena Centre for Research on Social Dynamics.

His research focuses on the applications of ICTs to the tourism sector, the study of complex systems and application of network science to tourism destinations. He has published several scientific and popular works and held courses and lectures at national and international level.
